Dear Friends and Family,

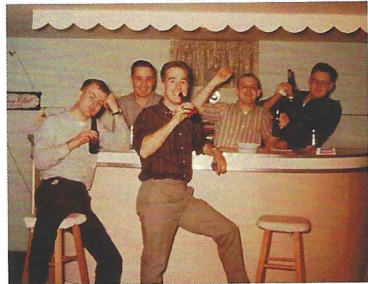
As we imagine it has been for all, this has been a year of change: positive and negative.

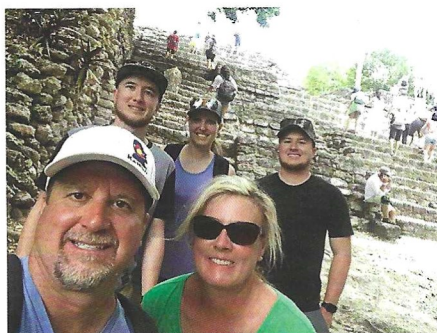

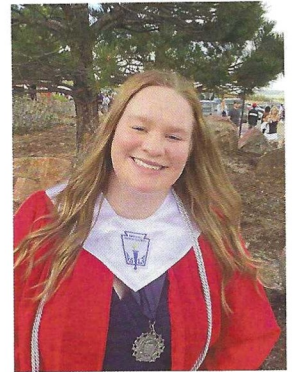
John, James, Tamara, Sonya, Justin
